Emperor I Fernando Reigns



TUCSON - Suspense, Glitter, Glamour, Pomp and Circumstance were the order of the evening last Monday at Jekyll's and Hyde's when Fernando Ochoa was crowned Emperor I Fernando of The Empire of Tucson, Arizona. After a full week of campaigning, campaign parties, Organizational meetings, balloting at each of the bars and judging, the five candidates learned the results of their labors at Midnight. Judging was conducted by five non-gay persons unknown to any of the candidates, which added to the impartiality of the selection. Staff members of AGN manned the ballot boxes at each of the bars, did the final ballot count, figured the percentages (40% for judging, 60% for popular vote) and arrived at the final selections. Rick Smith was runner-up and was appointed Prince Royale I. Jeff Nuzum ran third and was appointed The Grand Duke I.

The judging, which counted 40% in the final count, was most interesting with all candidates answering a different question concerning their goals if elected Emperor. Each expressed a desire to improve relations with the straight community, and made this project one of the major goals of the Tucson Court. The popular vote results are printed below, by bar, and indicate how important the various bars were in deciding who was most popular in each location and how well the candidates did in their respective campaigns.

Joining in the festivities of the night were Empress I Cicely of Tucson and many members of the Imperial Court of San Diego including Empress IV Nicole, Chairman of the Imperial Council of Courts and Dowager Empress of San Diego County; His Imperial Majesty Emperor V Terry of San Diego; Queen Mother V Bunny; Czar II Dennis; Crown Prince to The Empress Loren; Lord Prime Minister Brad; Grand Duke V Al; Countess V Miss Brooks; Royal Baby of California Jeff; Crown Prince to the Queen Mother of all California Richard and many other members of the San Diego Court too numerous to mention.

Over 400 persons were in attendance for the Coronation ceremonies at Jekyll's. Great entertainment was provided between presentations by Mahogany, Wang, Flo and Lavern. After the actual crowning of Emperor I Fernando, over 50 persons were investitured into the Court by Emperor I Fernando and Empress I Cicely. Some of them were Grand Duchess I Miss Mahogany; Imperial Princess Miss Wang; Lord Prime Minister Bud and various Barons, Dukes & Duchesses, Counts and Countesses, Lords and Ladies, etc. A proclamation was read during the ceremonies announcing that an Imperial and Official state of Unity exists between Tucson and San Diego, and that the two cities will be known as Sister Cities.

A fun evening full of suspense, drama, comedy and tragedy. We look forward to the Imperial Court of Tucson to be an active one in their assistance to the Tucson Gay Community. We extend our congratulations to our new Emperor I Fernando and wish him well.

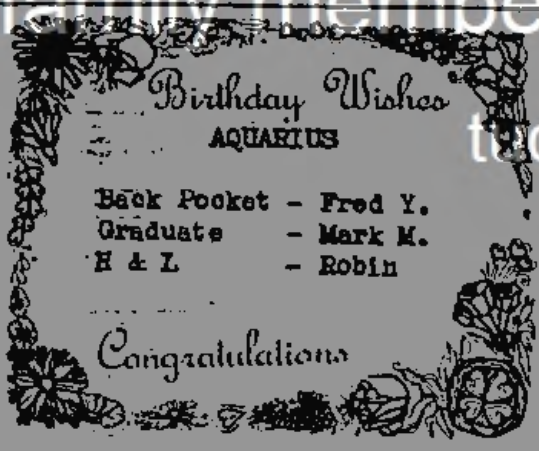

ACLU BACKS GAY RIGHTS FIGHT IN ARIZONA

Tucson City Council Bans Gay Discrimination

TUCSON - On Monday, February 7th, the Tucson City Council passed, by unanimous vote, an amendment banning discrimination in employment, housing and public accommodations based on sexual or affectional preference and/or marital status. The Tucson Gay Coalition has worked long and hard in getting this amendment to discriminatory practices against homosexuals passed. An attorney in the City Attorney's office has already been assigned to prosecute offenders. The penalty for violation of this ordinance as amended is \$300 fine and/or six months jail sentence.

As opposed to the feature story on this front page concerning our State Legislature, this news from Tucson City Council comes as a ray of sunshine. We take this opportunity to thank our Council for their forthright action, and we congratulate Tucson Gay Coalition for their diligence in getting this amendment passed. We can only hope that this "Gay Civil Rights Ordinance" for the City of Tucson will rub off on some of our State Legislators and let them see what an enlightened community can do for minority groups.

The time has come for all people, concerned with their civil liberties, to get off their duffs and become concerned! There are some people who are trying very hard to put our Gay lifestyle down. You are going to be labeled criminals. You are going to jail for doing what comes naturally. You are letting yourself open to criminal charges if you conduct your sexual life in any manner other than heterosexual. If this is what you want, if you are not concerned, if you don't care that the so called powers that be can run your lives from the floor of the Legislature, telling you what you can and cannot do in the privacy of your homes, between consenting adults, then that is your problem and please read no further. This article is for concerned persons! The only way we are going to stop this foolishness is to get concerned.

Shortly the Arizona State Legislature will be asked to vote on the Revised Arizona Criminal Code. We have spoken about this several times in the past. Apathy still seems to prevail. We warn you that unless something is done to stop passage of certain sections of this revision as they pertain to homosexual conduct, we all are in deep trouble. While most states are repealing anti-Gay sex laws, our Arizona Legislature is going to enact new laws banning Gay sex. There are some concerned citizens who are helping fight this slap in the face of the Gay Community. Many of them are non-Gay. They all realize what true freedom means, and are willing to stand up to put a stop to discriminatory laws. One of the leading non-Gay forces helping us in this fight is the Arizona Civil Liberties Union. This group is fighting tooth and nail to stop our Legislature from passing laws that affect any freedom that is constitutionally ours. They need your help. We urgently request that you join them in their efforts to help us.

In Phoenix this Saturday, February 12th, at Casa De Roma, 4331 N. 16th Street at 3 p.m., there will be a meeting that will be moderated by Nancy Hicks, Executive Director of A.C.L.U. There will be other A.C.L.U. members and several members of the Arizona Legislature who are opposed to the revision. The Legislative members will attend to see just how interested the Phoenix Gay Community is in fighting the passage of the Revised Criminal Code. Here is your chance Phoenix. Get it together and come to the Casa at 3:00 in the afternoon this Saturday in droves to show these people that you do not want your rights violated. Tucsonians of course are invited to the Casa meeting and we hope many will attend. If you do, be sure to make your presence known.
